

Chrispark



Chrispark features familiar plantings, like mountain laurel and salvia, as well as less common botanical species, including:

- GIANT TIMBER BAMBOO**—a semi-tropical clumping bamboo that rapidly increases in size. With heights up to 55-feet, it is one of the few large-growing bamboos from Asia that works well in the Texas climate
- KNOCK OUT ROSE**—this newer hybrid features continually blooming fluorescent red flowers
- CHITALPA TREE**—a deciduous hybrid of the *catalpa* and *desert willow* (*chilopsis*) with orchid-like flowers
- BARBADOS CHERRY**—despite the name, this native mounding shrub bears a small red fruit that's often harvested for use in vitamins
- CHINESE YELLOW BANANA**—a non-fruiting plant with a waxy yellow flower that looks like a lotus
- BAMBOO MUHLEY GRASS**—a stunning perennial grass that grows three to six feet high with feathery leaves
- MOUNTAIN PEA**—a legume that works here as an evergreen groundcover with small purple blooms and deep green leaves
- MERMAID ROSE**—an ever-blooming rose with a creamy yellow center accompanied by shiny saucer-sized petals
